

YOUTH OPPORTUNITY IMPACT

12,711 community members supported

United Way of Treasure Valley made a significant impact across three key areas this year. From preparing young children for school to supporting students' growth inside and outside the classroom, and equipping older youth with the skills needed for life after high school, our efforts ensured a brighter future for thousands in our community.

HFAITH IMPACT

44,245 community members supported

United Way of Treasure Valley made a positive impact on the health and well-being of our community by promoting healthy habits, providing essential preventative medical and dental services, and ensuring access to behavioral health support. These efforts helped individuals and families across the Treasure Valley lead healthier, more resilient lives.

FINANCIAL SECURITY

3,697 community members supported

United Way of Treasure Valley advanced financial stability in our community by providing job education and training, leading to better financial literacy and livable wage jobs. Additionally, we improved access to housing programs, helping hundreds of individuals and families secure affordable permanent housing.

32,224 community members supported

findhelpidaho.org continues to be an asset to our community. This last year saw the number of available programs on findhelpidaho.org increase to 4,471. Idaho residents performed a combined 226,800 searches where they were connected with resource providers through a database of up-to-date free and reduced-cost services.

COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

8,240 community members supported

The United Way of Treasure Valley-backed Community Schools initiative made a comprehensive impact by preparing children for school, supporting students in and out of the classroom, and equipping young adults for life after high school.

ICCS

41 schools statewide

The Idaho Coalition for Community Schools empowered 41 schools statewide, creating thriving environments for students and families. Additionally, the ICCS Collaborative Funders provided vital funding and direct support to 17 schools, making a significant impact.
